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Introduction to LiPo part 2

In my previous article submission, I mistakenly announced limited usage of Lipo batteries (racing division only) at the upcoming 2009

NRCTPA Spring Nationals. When first discussed, it was to be limited to the Open class. But after further debate and evaluation, we, the directors and Executive board of the NRCTPA decided it was best to allow Lipo batteries in all of the classes within the racing division. Remember, they can only be 2S Lipo and **must** be on the ROAR approved list of Lipo batteries. Also, use of approved Lipo charging bags is a must as well. The list of approved charging bags is as follows:

Common Sense Lipo bag Racers Edge Lipo Bag K&S Lipo bag WoodWorks Lipo Sack

MaxAmps Lipo sack

Also a Thank You to those that ran the Monster Truck side. Hope to see everyone again real soon!

On to some new info. We have many people asking about running the Digger Carpet class again. I am

pleased to inform you that we are going to give it a try! Pull them off of the shelf and dust them off. For those that do not have one, GOOD NEWS. They are available at www.bolink.com. Go to his web site and go thru his contact link if he does not have the Digger listed vet. Tim Bruns has bought the Bolink name and some of there products. The Digger and Bodies is part of it. He is offering Digger Chassis for \$30 + shipping. They chassis includes the frame, front end, and body mounts. You will need to ADD the Body, rear axle, bearings, 1/10 pan car hubs, spur

gear hub and gear (or a metal gear. 64 tooth max. All of these items are available at Hooter Chassis or your local Hobby Shop.(about \$30). He has 9 different bodies available as well. Pick out a set of tires and go pulling.

The rules will be the same except for the following:

The rear tires will be 1/10 pan car tires that can be bought at you local Hobby Shop.(Jaco,BSR,GRP,etc)

Everything must be under the body, and body must be in stock location.

EVENT RULE: 4WD INDEPENDENT SUSPENSION BY PAUL OVARES

Technology is a great thing. Many times it's racing that brings about major advancements in vehicle design as competitors search for faster ways around the track. New trucks and performance accessories help our hobby grow but sometimes the advantage is so great that it takes a while for the rest of the competition to catch up. At the past Worlds there was one racing advancement that the Regional Monster Truck Directors feel was a huge leap in truck design, the Traxxas E-Revo.

At the past Worlds this truck fit all the criteria for the Stock IS class but the lap times for this particular truck rivaled the Modified IS class trucks. There have been many suggestions by the Monster Truck Directors on how to help level the racing field but it does not make sense to make any permanent rule changes without a majority vote from the general membership. In an attempt to help level the field, we have decided to make an event rule for the 2009 Spring Nationals that cantilever suspension systems

will not be allowed in the Stock IS class. These trucks will be allowed to compete in the Modified IS class.

I have heard many suggestions on ways to improve both IS classes. I encourage everyone with suggestions on how to level the field in these classes and help them grow to bring their suggestions to the Town Hall Meeting so we can have a majority opinion on how the best structure these classes.
