I spent some time recently clearing out some of my old awards. Some of which have been re-plated and will be awarded at the Spring Nationals. Seeing all of these and some that I left behind got me to reminiscing. I purchased the first Clodbuster to be sold in Grand Rapids Michigan. I sold a full size truck just so that I could buy it. I don't believe that I slept for two days until I got that thing built. What a blast that thing was. I got good at driving it around at the shop that I worked. Until one day I got board with it and it sat on the shelf. For Christmas my wife bought me an original orange chassis RC10 (which is now for sale). That was fun and fast compared to the Clodbuster. Eventually I made it into a replica of my boss' Vintage Mustang race car. That was probably when it saw the most usage.

Then one July day I went to my local hobby store and bought a Midnite Pumpkin (also now for sale). While I was there I found out about truck pulling. I dove into this hobby full blast. The local club was competing two times per week.

That fall many of us went to the 1989 World Championships in Champaign Illinois. For me this was just about the biggest deal for me. I don't know as I have ever driven that far from home, I hadn't stayed in a hotel on my own before. Our group traveled in a group of three cars. I borrowed my boss' Cadillac Eldorado with its digital dash. About 30 miles from our destination, with four gallons of gas showing on the gauge, we ran out

of gas. So many stories about that weekend. It was a fabulous weekend and an experience that I will never forget.

The 1990 World Championships will live in many peoples memory for a long time. It became known as the all nighter. We started pulling around noon on Saturday and finished late Sunday evening. The 1991 World Championships was the year of the Pig Barn and Santa Claus as an announcer. Those first three years have such great memories for me.

Starting in 1992 the World Championships moved to the hotel we now call home. How cool was this, we never have to leave the hotel. Eat. sleep, play, and go swimming all of it at one location. That is a good thing because the nearest town to do much of anything is 30 miles away. I have many fond memories of this location although most are not as clear as the first three years. There was the year that Glen Singleton took Jan, Helen and myself off-roading with his minivan with the trailer attached. For me the big year was the year that I got my first World Championships.

For the most part, the past 16 World Championships have melted all together. I cannot tell one year from the other. The hotel is a great place and the staff is great. They let us take over the hotel for the weekend, they bend over backwards to get us everything that they can. What more could you ask for.

Well here is my list: a site more centrally located in the United

States and Canada, A site with more floor space, a site with area attractions that make it memorable. To me the events are a vacation. I usually take a day before and a day after to make it to the event. So I like to have some "me time" for the trouble.

I have had the opportunity to observe other hobbies and the location of their large events. For instance, the Family Motor Coach Assn, they have their large event once a year and it moves all around the country every year. The American Truck Historical Society does the same thing as does a Chevelle club that a co-worker belongs to.

I have also observed Clubs that have their event in the same place, on the same weekend of that month, year after year. While this repetitiveness gives them stability it can also make it monotonous. From year to year the photos all look the same.

Yes, I believe it is time to take this show on the road. Will this change the event as we know it? Yes it will. Could it make it better? Yes it can. Could we loose entries? Yes we may. Could we gain members? I bet we could.

Just remember, Location, Location, Location. This is the most important thing. As we get ready for our biggest election year, I would encourage the next group of officers to explore the concept of altering the location of the World Championships. Make a move, make a memory.
